# Owning a home helps families build wealth.

Although Lansing-East Lansing was the nation's most affordable major housing market last year, thousands of our neighbors still cannot afford a stable place to live. The Homeownership Program eliminates barriers for buyers who do not qualify for traditional lending, providing them access to affordable mortgages.

For Habitat homebuyers, the experience is life changing. This year, three homebuyers purchased homes we rehabilitated in partnership with Lansing Housing Commission, the most homes sold in the last five years.

### ramp program

The population in the Capital Region is aging, bringing with it the demand for safe, accessible entry to a growing number of homes. The Ramp Program provides this basic right to anyone in need of an accessibility ramp.

For Habitat partners, a ramp is life changing. In their 30th year, the Ramp Crews exceeded their goal, providing 38 homeowners and renters with stable access to their homes. Now, members of 900 households can stay in their homes, not worry about falls, and regain their independence.



# Building up neighbors builds community.

High material and labor costs keep home repairs out of reach for limitedincome homeowners, trapping them in homes that are in disrepair and threaten them with displacement.

With help from the Repair Program, two homeowners can remain safe and healthy in their homes, and countless community members can count on the church pavilion for resources and shelter. The impact goes beyond individuals and families, rippling out to the community and revitalizing neighborhoods.

Challenges with funding slowed the Repair Program down. Focus shifted to securing funding for the program and, in turn, providing access to repairs to more of our low-income neighbors in the future.


